Apples, oranges and bananas are simple and the school will keep to that. Looking to work with The Local for fresh options with minimal packaging. Idea to use Signup.com for parents to sign up to wash fruit & veggies.

Mariana Diez de Bonilla (absent, sent report) - partially eaten fruit going into the digesters.

Digesters are getting full. if we apply for more funding, we could add an additional digester, however not until the spring as the ground is frozen now. Option, two parent volunteers (Rachel & Marloes), to put surplus in their composters for winter months.

b) Lunch/Milk Program - Rachel

Going well, so far. Some personal pizza and milk orders were delivered to the school by our vendors on a recent hot lunch day. It is difficult to navigate orders placed outside of the school cash online system. Remind parents that orders must be placed online only.

- d) Water refill station project the idea to install 2 systems in our school is still up for discussion.
- iv. Fundraising Committee Jessica & Heather (absent)
 - a) Playground Project Aideen reported Asphalt will be resurfaced this year (capital project through the Board). The Engineer is back to look at the drainage. Perhaps he can help with ideas as to where to properly place the new play structure. Looking at an accessible playground - for younger smaller children.
 - b) Learning Enhancement Project Technology, Makerspace, Learning Commons Aideen reported

A new resource room to be built in the library is still planned through the Board (capital project).

New tables, chairs and book shelves to replace existing furniture in the library as part of the learning enhancement project.

Aideen & Mrs. Verellen met with the Board's Learning Coordinator and picked out some pieces.

Require 40 chairs (blue) to support two classes at once and staff meetings. Approx. \$1687. Six tables in grey, four bookcases at approximately \$998. Plus additional furniture, such as smaller pieces around the room. (not including area rugs yet)

\$10, 000 approximately for furniture to come from money held in Trust.
