EQAO results in reading showed improvement - in part due to the empower reading program??

Empower reading intervention program continues at JS for our 3rd year.

School Improvement Plan

- Focus is on Math assessment as learning.
- Self Regulation Mind up curriculum, building confidence as learners.
- French oral communication, encourage students to be using and responding in french.
- Guided Instructional Learning tables delivered last week. Is working well into the collaboration focus.
- also seeing student led collaboration in small groups.

Waste audit report - report was good and some areas need improvement.

Food waste - compostable waste will go into the digesters.

We need to look at what we are buying - small pieces of plastic no longer acceptable as a recyclable.

Boomerang lunches introduced - sending lunches with minimal waste.

The City of Stratford has hired someone to initiate a travel plan - looking at how children are getting to school, car, bus,

walk, bike etc. A survey will be conducted to gather information on how students/families are travelling to school. With high traffic, one issue is there are no crossing guards downtown. Police dept will also become involved.

Lead sampling - results came in good.
