Parent Out Reach Grant: We have reached out to a variety of organizations both local and distant and no one has responded to us. We have \$552.00 to spend on this (from the board).

Grade 8 Tech Day/ Art Day: occurred in the month of December- students went to St. Mikes for the day and had opportunities to explore different opportunities they will have when they head to high school

Have heard great things about the youth group. Programs are slowly getting back into full swing. Retreats ½ days from Gr. 1-8 all back in full swing. Includes music, art/craft, activities in the physical church, snack. Avon Thames is doing quite well compared to others in the diocese. (e.g. Edge Confirmation groups). What can CSAC do to support? Maybe \$\$ for bussing, helping with St. Vincent de St Paul (they are supporting many families right now with groceries and clothing + community kitchen). Perhaps JS could support one community kitchen? Provide volunteers? Maybe a class? Children's Liturgy needs more volunteers. Ony at 11:30 right now. They'd like to have it at more masses but they need the help. Taking time to reassess how we did things before COVID. How can we change them? Make them better? Graduation: Bishop Fabbro sent out documentation regarding graduations as many attendees aren't Catholic or not practicing (roughly 5% attend mass with any regularity), feel awkward and left out. He suggests honouring the grads at the last mass vs graduation masses. Avon Thames has decided to compromise and do a liturgy (in the church) vs mass this year and then re-evaluate. This will help to make things more accessible to ALL. A liturgy is just as valid as a mass.

Paula helping to coordinate Theatre Français - workshops are being planned for the spring, dates & \$TBD. All classes will be included.

Sophie came in, along with Michael (French monitor), before Christmas and did some work with some classes, not all classes had an opportunity to have her in.
